

## October - Black History Month [BHM]

Celebrated every October since 1987, Black History Month is the annual event that Addai-Sebo led the creation of. Officially recognised by the British government, it remembers and champions the history and achievements of the African diaspora, and educates and informs on black heritage and culture in Britain.

### BHM at the Gateway Academy

This year our Black History Month was organised and led by some of our amazing Equality Ambassadors. They planned different events for the fortnight to both raise awareness of the origins of Black History Month, the differences between different black cultures and to give students a hands-on experience. They made and sold badges celebrating different cultures represented in the academy, they organised for information to be shared with the PAD groups, worked to support the year group assemblies and provided some advertising for around the school.

Subjects such as PSHE and business studies were given the opportunity to take part in presentations from influential people who were able to explain the importance and contribution of Black people to the individual fields. They were fortunate enough to have presentations from Deborah Williams OBE, Chief Executive, Creative Diversity Network and Oluchi Ikechi, Partner, Head of Strategy & Transactions APAC, Capital Markets, Ernst & Young Parthenon. To help celebrate they organised with Ms Olufemi for traditional food to be available in the canteen and have arranged for bracelet making to be available in the canteen on the 31st October to help close Black History Month.









## BHM at the Gateway Primary Free School



The GPFS pupil leadership team visited each class three times a week to introduce students to a range of black role models, pupils have had many opportunities to discuss the importance of each person in class and at home. Classes have produced a wide range of outcomes to share their learning about the focus person for their year group.

Pupils performed to share the skills of Venus and Serena Williams, others read poetry to display the brilliance of Maya Angelou, and even online books to show information about the life of Barack Obama! Year groups shared their WOW moment for Black History Month on the school Padlet page. We are excited to close Black History Month on the first day of Autumn 2, by sharing these exciting moments with the children across GPFS.

### BHM at Tilbury Pioneer Academy



Herringham Primary Academy celebrated Black History Month throughout October.

Year 1 looked at Alma Woodsey Thomas. She was a teacher and artist. The children, in groups, recreated her famous artwork using very bright colours; as she loved colour.

## BHM at Lansdowne Primary Academy

Pupils started with an assembly focusing on the theme of all different but the same. This enabled the children to think about diversity and how they should celebrate this. This was followed up with PSHE lessons for each year group. Year groups celebrated black authors, poets and inspirational people. Year 1 used the Now, Press Play to learn about Mary Seacole. While the other year groups learnt poems to perform about inspirational people, such as Rosa Parks and Harriet Tubman or celebrated poets, such as Benjamin Zephaniah. Pupils also had the

opportunity to complete an independent research project on Google classrooms. Finally, end of day reading had a focus on exceptional men and bold women in BH.









## BHM at Tilbury Pioneer Academy



In Year 1, the pupils used 'Now Press Play' to learn about Mary Seacole and how she cared for injured soldiers in the Crimea. In Year 2, the pupils enjoyed learning all about Rosa Parks and how she stood up to injustice and made a change that impacted so many! They recited and recorded the poem 'Go to the back Rosa' The Year 5 pupils learnt about Benjamin Zephaniah. They were inspired by his story and background. They learnt his poem called 'The British Poem' and performed it together as a year group.

### Sharing our Lives Workshop









The students have enjoyed taking part in 2 workshops with Thurrock Productions for Sharing our Lives, to find, collect and record stories in their own communities.

Sharing our Lives is a creative heritage programme which seeks to find, record, curate and share the largely undocumented and unrecorded histories of the contributions and stories of migrants to and from Thurrock, throughout history and up to the present day. Thurrock Productions specifically seek to uncover and give a platform to previously unheard or marginalised stories and experiences.

The team are looking for community Heritage Champions. Local people with their own personal / family experience of migration, and/or a keen interest in local history, who will collaborate with us to collect and share stories, create new songs, curate an exhibition, a film and two large-scale events to share the work generated through the project, including playing a key role in Thurrock's celebrations for Windrush 75. You will receive a programme of training and development, as well as individual support from the project team. Training and support will be shaped according to your needs.
